

Costs and Fundraising

The whole Jamboree event runs over a 3-week period and involves international travel. This comes at a cost that may seem unobtainable for many to meet, but we implore young people and parents not to be daunted by fundraising or perceptions around cost and **we would like to ensure that the cost of this event does not stop any young person from applying and taking part.**

The final fee will be £3,490 per participant which will be spread over instalments throughout the year. The payment schedule will be communicated upon acceptance of your place. There is an initial deposit of £500 which is due on acceptance of your place at the end of October.

We will work together with all the successful participants, supporting you to raise the funds from a mix of **individual contributions, fundraising, grants, bursaries and donations**, to ensure everyone, whatever their financial background and circumstances can take part.

It's important to highlight that the unit, the leadership team and the county can only help you with this, not raise all the money for you, especially as the time and work you commit to fundraising is a big part of your individual Jamboree experience and meeting your fee target should be seen as a huge personal achievement, helping you gain valuable Skills for life.

To help inspire you, we will cover some of the ways past participants have worked to raise the funds in the information events.

And, we will also be running sessions with the unit, throughout the build-up, to support with ways to raise funds, as well as running unit fundraising events, sharing information about grants and bursaries and making sure you are keeping on target to get you to the Jamboree!
