1. Welcome and Introductions

Alan Sadler welcomed everyone to the meeting and introduced the guests, HM Deputy Lord Lieutenant of Cambridgeshire, Very Rev. Mark Bonney and County Commissioners from Girl Guiding, Cathy Caterall, Carol Dalton and Claire Adams, together with Ian Newbery, Regional Lead Volunteer. He then went through the health and safety instructions.

2. Apologies

Apologies were received from 335 members, including Alex Alexander and Richard Hames, Vice Presidents.

3. Governance Topics

a) Minutes of 2023 AGM

The minutes have been previously reviewed by the County Trustee Board at their first meeting after the previous AGM.

b) Constitution from POR

The model constitution from Policy, Organisation and Rules (POR) was approved.

c) County's financial year

The financial year of 1st January to 31st December was approved.

d) Community members of County Scout Council

Approval was given to Girl Guiding County Commissioners for Cambridgeshire East and West

e) Number of members appointed to Trustee Board

This was approved as 6 members plus 2 ex-officio members

f) Quorum for future meetings

This was approved as 15 members.

4. Review of the previous year

a) County Lead Volunteer's review of the year

Chris introduced himself and explained his role. The county is on target for moving Scouting forward in a safe manner. Chris is very proud of the progress. There are 6,600 young people across 8 Districts, which is an increase of 3% on 2023, and only 4% below pre-pandemic levels. Adult volunteer numbers have also increased. Currently there are 2,200 young people on the waiting lists. Squirrels are now in its 3rd year with 275, 4-6 year olds across 31 Dreys and the Chief Scout Acorn award has been introduced.

Chris explained the re-organisation structure across Scouting was about getting the right people in the right roles. He thanked the District Lead Volunteers for all they have done across their Districts.

Three Youth leads have been appointed to help make the movement more youth led. They are James Metheram, Ana Ward and Sophie Hallet. James explained that the plan is for them to share the role and meet with Youth leads in each District. This would enable the young people to have more of a say in programming etc. There are currently 300, 18-25 year olds in the County.

Chris detailed some of the events taking place in the County, including Beavers in Tents, which is usually the first camping experience for Beavers. As the Camping Permit is provided by the experienced organising team, it enables leaders without permits to attend with their Colonies. There are events for every section taking place. The Volunteering Development team provides support to induction and learning as well as recognising volunteers for their achievements and the Support Team carries out tasks such as maintenance of property, finances and general support.

Last year the World Scout Jamboree took place in Korea. Chris was involved in the selection process and supported the team in the UK. James Metheram went to the Jamboree as a member of the International Support Team. He explained it was a fantastic experience, and everyone should be encouraged to attend. Despite the adverse conditions, the participants adapted well. The change in programme meant they got to spend extra time in Seoul. 50,000 scouts from around the world gathered in South Korea, with 45 young people and 5 adults being from Cambridgeshire.

Chris then talked briefly about the Coronation in 2023, which James was also able to participate in, together with Conan Fryer and Ellie-Anne Watts. Everyone who took part was awarded the Coronation Medal, which is a National Honour and was presented to James, Conan and Ellie-Anne at the Windsor celebration day. James said he was very proud and lucky to have been selected. He was based at the VIP security checkpoint which was an incredible experience.





Kings Scout Awards have also been presented to Russell Challis, Daniel Carlton Binmore and Sebastian Parton.

Chris presented a slide listing 92 volunteers who had achieved a Good Service Award in the past year. Ed Sowells pointed out that some of them had previously been Beavers, which shows progression of young people into volunteering roles. Chris also noted that a young person had also received the Meritorious Award during the year.

Scouting in Cambridgeshire is about giving young people fabulous experiences. Chris thanked all volunteers who have contributed to our success this year.

b) Review and consider Annual Report including the annual Statement of the Accounts Nigel Poulter, County Treasurer gave a summary of accounts and explained the profit and loss with more details e.g. membership size and events.

Last year the accounts moved into recognising deposit interest, which includes Abington Fund, some is accrued but not yet paid. Currently, receiving 5%. The accounts are healthy. The County membership charge was not increased and will be reduced, if possible, in the future.

Alan went through the pie chart of expenditure and thanked Chris and Nigel for their reports.

5. Making Appointments

- a) Following recommendation from the open selection process initiated by the County Trustee Board, the meeting was asked to:-
 - a. Appoint the County Chair
 Chris nominated Alan Sadler as County Chair, this was approved
 - Appoint the County Treasurer
 Alan nominated Nigel Poulter as County Treasurer, this was approved
 - c. Appoint members of the County Trustee Board Trustees appointed: Tim Burgess, Colin Daniels, Simon Keen and Rhys Davies (who is a new volunteer). Ex-officio trustees are Chris Ward and Ana Ward. Approval was given. There are 10 retiring Trustees, who Alan thanked for all their support, all have agreed to take on other roles
- b) Julie Spence, His Majesty's Lord Lieutenant was re-appointed County President, together with Vice Presidents, Alex Alexander, Richard Hames and Steve Taylor.
- c) Bradshaw Johnson were appointed the Independent Examiner
- d) Colin Daniels and Ana Ward were elected as representatives of the County Scout Council on the Council of the Scout Association

The Very Rev Mark Bonney, Deputy Lord Lieutenant gave a speech on behalf of the County President.

Mark said it was an honour to be representing HM Lord Lieutenant. He is currently the Dean of Ely and has only represented HM Lord Lieutenant a few times. It was 60 years since he was a Cub Scout. It is critical to provide opportunities such as Scouting for young people to develop. Mark was pleased to hear about the diversity of young people across Cambridgeshire and in particular the success of the muslin Scout Groups in Cambridge and Peterborough. On behalf of HM Lord Lieutenant he thanked everyone for their dedication.

Alan thanked The Very Rev Mark Bonney for his kind words.
